



Sports Premium Action Plan 2019/20

Throughout the year we've invested the sports premium into sports coaches and lunch-time supervisors to provide various extra-curricular clubs and lunchtime provision e.g. Football, hockey, basketball and various sports of the Olympics. Additionally, sports premium has been used to fund transport, certificates, and medals for cluster events with our local schools. This provides the children with healthy competitive sports and rewards them for taking part. A portion of the sports premium has been used, alongside other funding, to improve the facilities around the school for break times and lunchtime in the future. Finally, a portion has been used to upgrade/replace sports equipment and facilities for being active in EYFS, KS1 and KS2 so we can provide higher quality PE and encourage children of all ages to be active. Due to Covid-19, a larger portion of the funding has been re-directed to the upgrade of the facilities from other areas.
