

Sports Premium Action Plan 2024/25

Total Fund Allocated - £17,680 Total Spent: £17,355.43

Throughout the year sports premium will be used to fund transport, certificates, and trophies for cluster events with our local schools. This provides the children with healthy competitive sports and rewards them for taking part. Additionally, we'll invest the sports premium into Sports Coaches to provide various extra-curricular clubs and meaningful lunchtime provision along with our school's sports leaders e.g. Football, tennis, badminton, hockey, basketball etc. Sports coaches will also be funded to team-teach with staff and up-skill in areas of the curriculum they feel they need extra support with. A portion will be used to upgrade/replace sports equipment and facilities for being active in EYFS, KS1 and KS2 so we can provide higher quality PE and encourage children of all ages to be active. Some of the sports premium will also be used for enrichment days e.g. dance and glow-dodgeball. Finally, some of the sports premium will be used towards forest school equipment to enhance this provision.
